█ Thank you again for having CCAN at the Social Justice Fair. I would say I spoke to around four people who would be potential volunteers, and I collected 15 petition

signatures. One suggestion for the next fair: I am not sure whether this was done, but perhaps at the end of the service, briefly mention each group that has a table along with a sentence or two about their issue. This way, if someone is interested in one of the groups/issues, they know which table to look for. It seemed as though the majority of people did not walk around to look at all the tables. ■ Thanks to the Organizers whose considerable efforts we are grateful. CLUUC members and friends could glimpse over at least those displays, in which they may have had some interest beforehand. The usual short time in the lounge after service, however, allowed an enterprising spectator to visit 2 or 3 displays.

A more effective Social Justice Fair, I believe, would be possible if it were held at least 2 hours some afternoon, perhaps including a luncheon, where attendees would have the opportunity to visit more displays. Several Exhibitors, moreover, could be invited to make brief presentations to the whole assembly, making use of our media facilities in the auditorium. The traditional nature of a Fair is supposed to expose attendees to new causes. Would it be too ambitious to organize a series of events where various groups in turn could expound their respective causes? (Peacemaking; Ralph Krause)
